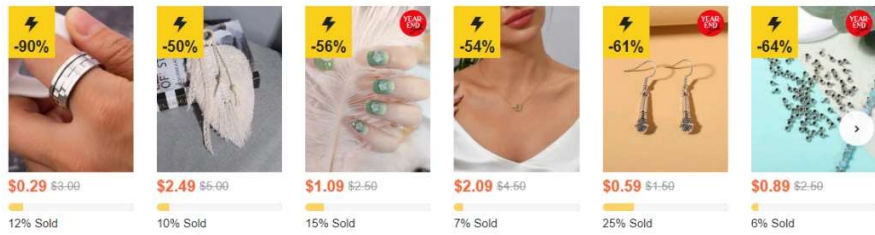

I used JAWS to evaluate this website. I used the version JAWS 2023 on the browser Microsoft Edge for the manual inspection.

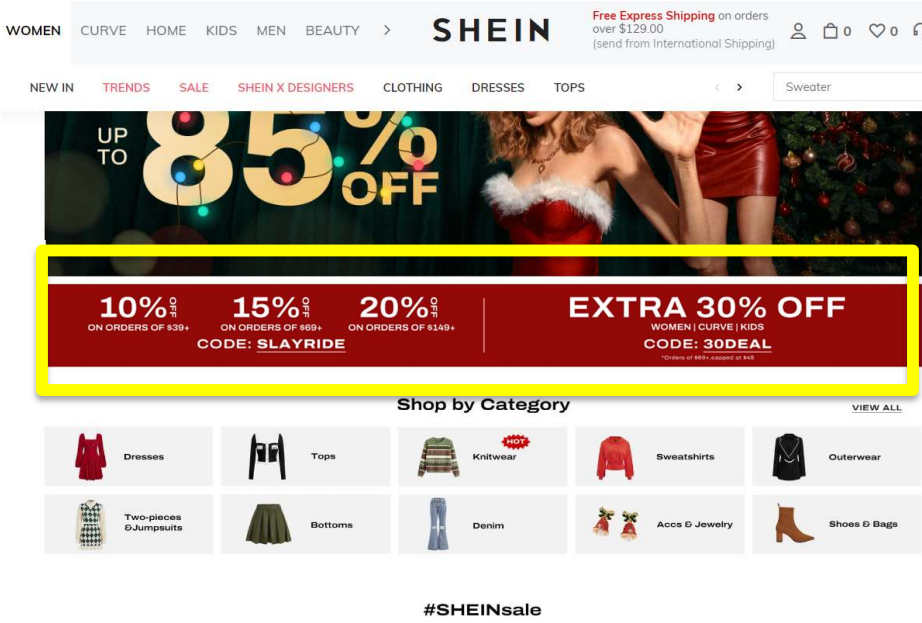

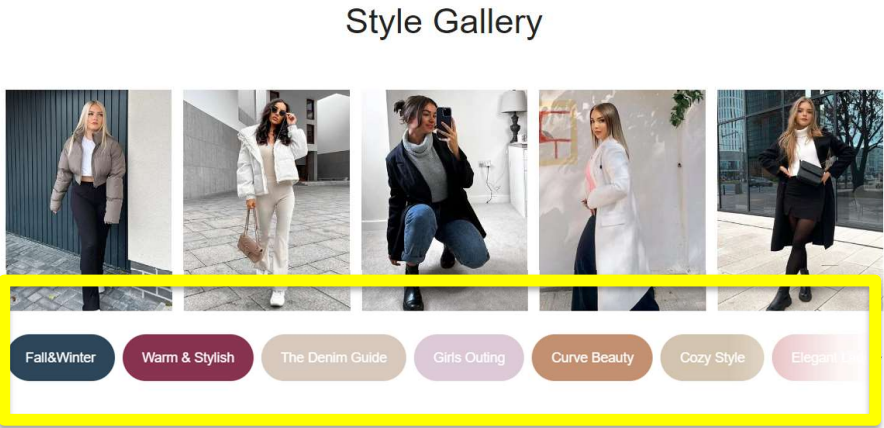

<p>Description of Violation:</p>	<p>The images consist of text that aren't picked up by a screen reader.</p> <p>To the best of my knowledge, this website violated WCAG 1.1.1 by the non-inclusion of alternative text in deal categories listed under the 'Flash Sale'. The problem first came into fore when the images when JAWS detected these images as 'Blank'. The code doesn't include the alt-text for these images, but link to the pages that have this deal applied.</p>

<p>Description of Violation:</p>	<p>JAWS couldn't read the information in the highlighted banner. Upon further inspection, it turned out that the banner was an image consisting of the text. It is neither customizable, nor is it essential for it to be an image instead of a text. Hence, this violates the guideline.</p>

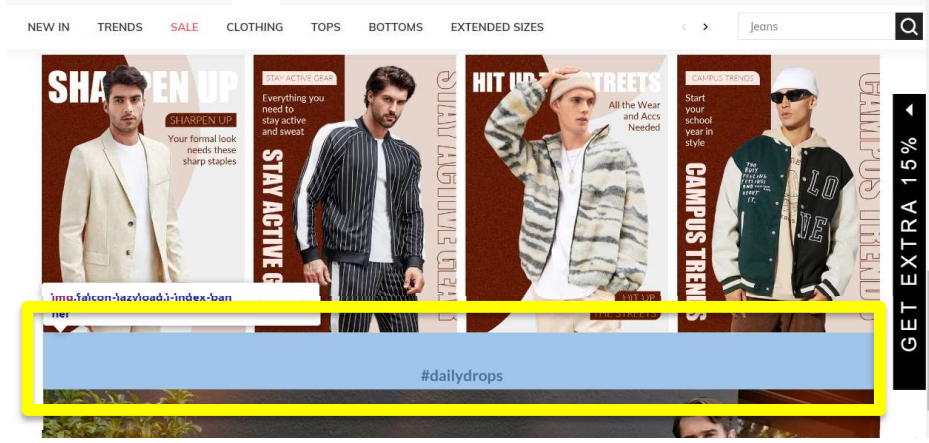
<p>WCAG Guideline: <b>1.4.3 Contrast (Minimum)</b>  <b>Level AA</b></p>	<p>The visual presentation of text and images of text has a contrast ratio of at least 4.5:1, except for the following:</p> <p><b>Large Text</b> Large-scale text and images of large-scale text have a contrast ratio of at least 3:1;</p> <p><b>Incidental</b> Text or images of text that are part of an inactive user interface component, that are pure decoration, that are not visible to anyone, or that are part of a picture that contains significant other visual content, have no contrast requirement.</p> <p><b>Logotypes</b> Text that is part of a logo or brand name has no contrast requirement.</p>

<p>Description of Violation:</p>	<p>I suspected that the buttons violate this guideline because they were visibly out of the contrast ratio. To verify, I picked the hexadecimal code for the text and background colors using a color picker browser extension, and put it through WebAIM's Contrast checker. The contrast was 1.57:1, which didn't clear Level AA for this guideline.</p>

<p>WCAG Guideline: <b>1.4.13 Content on Hover or Focus</b></p> <p><b>Level AA</b></p>	<p>When receiving and then removing pointer hover or keyboard focus triggers additional content to become visible and then hidden, the following are true:</p> <p><b>Dismissible</b> A mechanism is available to dismiss the additional content without moving pointer hover or keyboard focus, unless the additional content communicates an input error or does not obscure or replace other content;</p> <p><b>Hoverable</b> If pointer hover can trigger the additional content, then the pointer can be moved over the additional content without the additional content disappearing;</p> <p><b>Persistent</b> The additional content remains visible until the hover or focus trigger is removed, the user dismisses it, or its information is no longer valid. <p>Description of Violation:</p>	<p>When the page is hovered over with only a keyboard, the search field expands into a menu of different other items/recommendations. However, it doesn't close when the focus is removed, nor it can be dismissed using the Esc key. It can only be dismissed by using a mouse pointer and clicking on a blank area on the page. It is not dismissible and overlays on key content on the page even when the tab focus is on something else. Hence, it violates the guideline.</p>

<p>Description of Violation:</p>	<p>When going through the headings of this page through JAWS, I realized that headings haven't been assigned the content, except the bottom of the page. Instead, these elements are imaged of texts masquerading as headings. Hence, no label has been assigned to the set of links below this image, and the page violates this guideline.</p>
